WHEREAS, through Executive Order 104 (October 27, 2012), the State of New Jersey declared a State of Emergency as a result of the impact of Super Storm Sandy and the aftermath; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Manasquan had also declared a local State of Emergency; and,

WHEREAS, 60% of the community's housing stock was affected by flood, sand and wind damage from Super Storm Sandy; and,

WHEREAS, resolution 66-2013 was approved by the Borough Council on February 23, 2013 appointing Kevin Thompson as additional qualified temporary staff to immediately assist with the multitude of tasks, such as, but not limited to, construction permit processing including Technical Assistant functions, scheduling of permits, delivery of FEMA and State related recovery information to residents, case management, insurance proof of loss appeals, mitigation program and grant management, to name a few; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is desirous of adding additional hours to Mr. Thompson's schedule for a maximum of 30 hours per week.

WHEREAS, FEMA allows for reimbursement for a percentage of storm related costs; and,
WHEREAS, the Borough of Manasquan will submit these costs to FEMA for reimbursement; and,
NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED on the 20th day of May, 2013, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Manasquan, in the County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey as follows:

THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT REIMBURSE RESIDENTS OF THE
BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN FOR THE ENTIRE COST OF RAISING HOMES
TO COMPLY WITH THE ADVISORY BASE FLOOD ELEVATIONS**

WHEREAS, Super Storm Sandy struck the State of New Jersey, inflicted unprecedented damage throughout the State and caused catastrophic flooding and damage to communities across the State, including the Borough of Manasquan; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) released Advisory Base Flood Elevations (ABFE) and Advisory Flood Hazard Maps (AFHM) to the community in December 2012; and

WHEREAS, on January 24, 2013 Governor Christie announced an emergency rule that mandates that the ABFE and the AFHM be the standard for new construction and substantial improvement throughout the entire state; and

WHEREAS, many of the flood-impacted areas within the Borough of Manasquan have changed to a higher base flood elevation and the residents are required to raise their homes to comply with these higher standards; and

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WHEREAS, the financial impact of the cost of raising homes to comply with the new standards is severe and the \$30,000 benefit from the Increased Cost of Compliance program is insufficient to reimburse the residents; and

WHEREAS, due to financial hardship, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan requests that the Federal Government authorize reimbursement of the complete cost of raising homes in the Borough of Manasquan to comply with the federally mandated higher base flood elevations.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED on this 20th day of May, 2013 by the Governing Body of the Borough of Manasquan, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. That the Governing Body requests that the Federal Government authorize complete reimbursement of the cost of raising homes to comply with the Advisory Base Flood Elevations.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Public Safety & Recycling -- Council Member McCarty reported that the police department is preparing for the summer. He stated that the Mayor has been putting a large amount of time, behind the scenes putting things together to get JCP&L to work on the problems that the Borough is having. He reported on public safety where a resolution was approved to advertise part time records clerk and anyone interested should look at the borough website to apply. He reported that he along with the Chief of Police met with Squan Strong to follow up on the general approval from the committee the event that they want to have in the

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Plaza. He reported that the Planning Board has been busy with meetings and reported on a meeting regarding the new flood maps being released shortly. He went over some of the items discussed at a recent meeting regarding the flood maps.

Parks & Public Property – Council Member Olivera reported that the electrical for the boat docks has not been up and running but has been assured that the electric has been fixed and will be working by the end of the week. He reported that the Life Saving Station has had its first remediation check after the storm and he reports that it is pretty good shape. He reported that a test will be taken place to find out if there is mold behind the walls. He reported that the committee and Joe DeLorio met with Jersey Cares on doing some project work in Manasquan based on Sandy damage. He stated that there are certain projects that have been looked at for them to come in to help the town out with financial banking of a French bank. He went over the projects that the organization will be doing in town.

Administration and Finance Committee – Council Member Mangan reported on the budget update regarding the Community Disaster Loan Program and he reported that the Borough has received the maximum amount allowed which is \$5 million or 25% of operating expenses. He advised that the borough received the 25%, which is \$2,769,837. He advised that the committee will be meeting this week to go over the impact of this loan for the Borough. He went over the schedule for the introduction of the budget. He reported that Tourism will be celebrating the beach opening this Thursday at the Inlet with a cocktail party to follow at Leggetts. He went over some grant programs that are available for local tourism commissions.

Public Works Committee – Council Member Donovan on the lift stations, Inlet project, Third Avenue revention program and Riverside Drive, bulk pick up and a recommendation from Black and Veatch for Willow Way area. He advised that this week is National Public Works Week and if anyone has an opportunity to thank DPW please do so because they are doing a great job.

Law and Code Committee – Council Member Sinneck reported that he attended a luncheon today at the Little League Field for Habitat for Humanity and Allstate who are teamed up in Manasquan to help residents recover from the storm and get back into their homes. He reported on the Code/Construction/Zoning permits and income for the month compared to last year. He went over some changes that have taken place in the department to move permits along in the process.

Beach Committee – Council Member Bosson reported on the junior guard information, no dogs allowed on beach until November including the walkway, badge sales and parking pass update, and the temporary beach office and the hours of operation. He read an excerpt from the newspaper regarding the recovery at the beach and all the people that were involved and will be involved in getting the beach opened for the 2013 season.
